What is an ultrasound?

Ultrasound scans are images of the internal organs created from sound waves.

What does an ultrasound show?

Ultrasound scanning is used to help monitor and diagnose conditions in many parts of the body including the kidneys, the liver and the heart. It is often used to examine conditions affecting the organs in a woman's pelvis, uterus, fallopian tubes, and ovaries. Ultrasound scanning is not dangerous and has no side effects, so it is safe to use during pregnancy.

How is an ultrasound scan performed?

The ultrasound scanner looks like a small roller. As it moves back and forth over the body, it sends sound waves through the skin and muscles. These waves are then turned into an image that appears on a TV screen.
